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Donations story

- The first electric wheelchair donation was delivered to Monang (born John Dall Thomasson Saroha Hutahaean, 7-year old) he is a child of Ms. Helanaty, his father is a police-man in Cirebon city, West Java. Monang is living with a rare bone condition called Osteogenesis Imperfecta (OI).
- Even with countless challenges in taking care of their son, the family remain to have positive outlook and spirit in life.
- The mother of Monang decided to see Ger Kamer in 2016 and upon evaluation Ger decided that the best available solution is to give him an electric wheelchair.

Donations story

- Thanks to Ger Kamer and our sponsor company WRT, we delivered a brand new electric wheelchair to Monang and his family.
- Living with OI in Indonesia is full with challenges, since the majority of public space has not been updated to accommodate people with disability.
- The wheelchair has enabled Monang to move more freely on his own, play with his friends, and go to school. Before he got the wheelchair, he had been carried around by his mother.



Osteogenesis Imperfecta (OI)

- Also called: *brittle bone disease*
- A group of inherited disorders characterised by fragile bones that break easily¹
- Even sneezing and coughing can cause bone fractures
- Treatment and mobility device can help, but it cannot be cured

Main goals

1. Delivering two more electric wheelchair in 2018 through appropriate selection criteria
2. Getting more companies to participate in the program

Economic Context

- The average minimum wage per month for Indonesian is IDR 1.997.819 (less than EUR 120) per month²
- The cost of an electric wheelchair is around 22 million IDR to 27 million (around EUR 1500)

Wheelchair purchase

- We purchased an electric wheelchair with this specification:
 - Soleil Powered Wheel Chair F5123-45
 - Unit price: IDR 24.995.000 (1500 EUR)
 - Discounted price: IDR 22.495.000 (1400 EUR)
 - Purchased from Ace Hardware at Living Plaza, Cirebon, INDONESIA

Selection Criteria

- Background:
 - According to our experience, many donation receiver (not all) does not take care assistive equipment well enough.
 - Many of them also does not use the equipment regularly for maximum value.
- Stricter Selection Criteria is needed.

Selection Criteria

- Indonesian National (WNI)
- Diagnosed as Osteogenesis Imperfecta (OI) (with Medical certificate)
- Willing to travel to Cirebon city, West Java to receive the wheelchair in person
- Willing to be interviewed
- Documents needed:
 - 1-page essay by the parents on “How the wheelchair would improve the quality of life of my child”
 - Letter of insufficient finance from government (SKTM)
 - Signed letter of wheelchair maintenance and reuse
- All completed documentations except the maintenance and reuse form to be sent to Yayasan Harapanku Cirebon by mail maximum 7th of July, 2018.
